CALs Corner Part 55

2015 Youth Stamp Camp

10 February 2015 saw the release of a 80c gummed CAL for Camp Conical, Hamner Springs. The Christchurch Youth Stamp Club, for young stamp collectors age 6-18, organiser Karen Jeffrey; Canpex Inc.; and the 2015 Youth Stamp Camp, organiser Geoff Tyson, have jointly produced a CAL as a fundraiser for the Hamner Springs Camp, in Jollies Pass Road from 10-16 April 2015. The design of the CAL features the observation platform at the top of Conical Hill in Hamner Springs. First Day Covers dated 10 Feb 2015 were produced.

2015 Chloe & Carter wedding

An 80c self-adhesive CAL was released February in celebration of the marriage of Chloe Hill and Carter Schwartz, of Upper Hutt. Underneath a smiling photo of the happy couple are two dates: 16.10.14 their engagement date; and 18.7.15 the wedding date.

2015 Affordable Funeral Directors

An 80c CAL has been released February 2015 advertising the services of a Funeral Director company in the greater Wellington area and giving their freephone number.

2015 Kiwi Stamp Circuit

The latest CAL issue from the long-running series of "Mr Kiwi" CALs arrived on 24 March 2015. This is an 80c gummed CAL on the theme of cricket and is the tenth CAL from Stamp Dealers Kiwi Stamp Circuit of Glen Innes, Auckland. Their list thus now comprises: 2007 1d Dominion, 2008 and 2009 Mr Kiwi, 2010 Football World Cup and Commonwealth Games, 2011 Rugby World Cup, 2012 Olympic Games, 2013 Mr Kiwi, 2014 Commonwealth Games and now 2015 Cricket World Cup. First Day Covers were produced Auckland 24 March 2015.

2015 Arrowtown

A most attractive set of two gummed CALS have been issued March 2015 for the South Island tourist village of Arrowtown. The 80c CAL depicts a snow capped postbox, the famous Edward VII Penfold hexagonal red postbox outside Arrowtown Post Office and the \$2.00 CAL shows a street view of the actual Post Office itself, the iconic Post and Telegraph Office building built in 1915.

2015 The Capital Stamp Show 2015

The second issue of CALs has been released for this Stamp Show to be held at the TSB Bank Arena, 4 Queens Wharf, Wellington City on 23 – 25 October 2015. The two 80c CALs depict: a King George V 1d red NZ postage postal stationery die and a bronze lion

at the base of the Cenotaph column, Wellington. Erected to commemorate the dead of World War I it was unveiled in 1931; the two bronze lions were added after World War II.

A First Day Cover dated Wellington 27 March 2015 shows a 3d Cinderella from 1915 a Wellington Queen-Carnival stamp inscribed 'Help Our Boys they are helping you'. Two maxicards were also available.

Matariki VIII - Kowhaiwhai: Maori modern art

Well, I really do not know what to make of this set. One either has an appreciative eye for modern art – Maori or otherwise – or one does not. I am sorry to say that to me these stamps simply look like a series of pretty patterns in bright colours, some regular, some decidedly irregular. They do little or nothing for me. However, quite a different reaction was received when they were shown to a colleague here in the office with connections to the artworld, who replied: "Oh how fascinating, what interesting designs!' So, you can never tell.

Designs:

80c "Digiwhaiwhai" by Johnson Witehira

80c "Tenei au tenei au" (This is me, this is me) by Kura Te Waru Rewiri, a painting described by the artist as "occupying space with recovered memories".

\$1.40 "Haki" from the series "Whakahokia mai te mauri" by Kylie Tiuka

\$2.00 "Banner Moon" from the series "Land Protest 1975-1976", reworked in 1982 by Buck Nin (1942 - 1996). "Banner Moon" is described as depicting a landscape seen through the lattice of a carved canoe prow.

\$2.50 Part of the "Te Hatete o Te Reo" series by Ngatai Taepa

\$3.00 "Taona Marama" (Night Lights of the City) by Sandy Adsett.

Designed by Rangi Kipa and Roy McDougall and printed by Southern Colour Print Ltd, Dunedin by offset lithography in the four process colours; self-adhesive stamps printed on Tullis Russell 210gsm PSA red phosphor self-adhesive stamp paper, die-cut perfs p.9½x10 horizontal stamps and p.10x9½ vertical stamps, in sheets of 25 with vertical and horizontal roulettes and in jumbo-roll setenant blocks of six without roulettes. Gummed miniature sheets printed on Tullis Russell 104gsm red-phosphor gummed stamp paper perf 13½.

Eighty-Five Years Ago

From The New Zealand Stamp Collector – August 1930

The Charity Stamp Help Stamp Out Tuberculosis.

I am indebted to Mr. Skinner, the New Zealand Government Printer, for particulars of the method employed in the production of the Charity Stamp, issued last Christmas.

Mr. Skinner advises that the method employed for making the plate was what is known as the zinc etching process, which is familiar in the production of line-blocks for commercial printing.

The design was drawn to the size of about 6in. by 5in. This was reduced to a third of the size by photography. Eighty reproductions of the print were taken and were assembled in eight horizontal rows of ten, care being taken to have the correct spacing between each print. The sheet was then further reduced by photography to bring each stamp to the correct size and a print was made on to a zinc plate which was then etched to form the printing plate.

There has been some question as to the actual number of this stamp issued, one official report stating that the special fund had benefitted to the extent of about £1400; while according to another statement over £2000 was obtained. Nevertheless the fact remains that there are no big holdings of this particular stamp in New Zealand. Many collectors were not aware until too late that the stamp was being withdrawn on 28 February. In many of the offices only a small stock was held just before the date of withdrawal and at the Christchurch Chief Post Office to which our publishers applied for stocks on the last day only three sheets could be obtained. From inquiries which I have made it is clear that the stamp is much rarer than is generally believed and I am quite confident that it will not be long before such small holdings as exist will become exhausted. As to the approximate value of the stamp it is of course difficult to express an opinion as so much depends upon popularity. As a means of comparison it may be stated that there were fewer of these stamps issued than of the 6d Christchurch Exhibition and that the numbers issued approximate fairly closely to the 6d Kookaburra of Australia.

Fifty Years Ago

From the CP NZ Bulletin – August 1965

The Late RJG Collins by Campbell Paterson

With the passing of Ray Collins New Zealand Philately loses the man who for 45 years was its inspiration, guide and genius. It is not possible to think of a similar case in any other country where one man so completely towered above his contemporaries in everything to do with stamps.

It may be that to collectors in Great Britain or the Commonwealth the name of Ray Collins is little known. Of late years he devoted his time almost entirely to the preparation and editing of the monumental Handbooks, - the four volumes known by the title "The Postage Stamps of New Zealand". No-one who has these volumes will need to be told that the man behind them was truly great. One has but to compare them with the definitive works on the stamps of any other country to know that here was genius. But they were only the final grand efforts in an incredible record of achievement.

Ray Collins started his own business in stamps in the early 1920's while still young. At first in partnership with his lifelong friend Laurie Vernazoni, (happily still with us), then later on his own, as Verne Collins & Co., it was not long before he produced N.Z.'s first specialized Catalogue, - a grand work that set a standard of scholarly thoroughness never to be excelled. Another early publication was "The New Zealand Stamp Collector", a magazine that he later handed on to the N.Z. Federation of Philatelic Societies, who still publish it. This is unquestionably the longest-lived stamp magazine in N.Z. For something close to 40 years in Ray Collins' care the N.Z.S.C. was the foremost N.Z. authority on matters philatelic. The Editorial approach was always to maintain an impeccable accuracy in reporting and to foster at all times the study of facts on proper scientific lines.

The line of 'firsts' to Ray's credit is formidable. The first Specialised Catalogue; the First Postal History Catalogue; the first Airmail Catalogue; the first regular Magazine; the first Pacific Islands Catalogue. These works alone would have been sufficient to place Ray Collins on a peak well out of reach of any subsequent writer; but then came the Handbooks! Truly the record of a philatelist without equal anywhere.

If the picture given above, of a man busily writing and spending much of his life on research gives the suggestion of a bookish recluse, then I have written badly. Above everything Ray was a man who by some further touch of genius seemed never to be short of time. His works are the works of a lifetime, yet one never saw him other than relaxed,

friendly and apparently with nothing to do but to give of his time without stint. Thus he was with everybody. No-one was ever too insignificant to be given a whole day if need be. I recall my first meeting with Ray in 1946. I was then a junior professional with an Auckland firm of dealers. Ray gave me three days of his precious time. One whole day we spent on a visit to Sir Heaton Rhodes and I had the privilege of seeing the famous Rhodes collection with Ray at my elbow telling me what I ought to be noticing and pointing out the unique rarities; - that was a tremendous experience.

Not again will we see the like of this generous, happy genius. It is a privilege to have known him and to have the works that he has left behind him, monuments to a life spent in the service of a hobby he loved and of his fellow philatelists.


