# New Issue Notes

## World War I New Zealand's Story III 1916 Courage and Commitment (6 April 2016)

Here is the third annual instalment (of five) in New Zealand's homage to the Great War. The multiple issue format is unchanged – a set of twenty stamps: a block of six, two setenant pairs and a sheetlet of ten; two miniature sheets, one of six and one of four; and a commemorative prestige booklet containing twelve booklet panes.

**80c Solomon Isaacs – Serving his Country.** Originally from the Cook Islands, Solomon Isaacs was one of many Pacific Islanders who volunteered to serve in the First World War. For nearly three years he was overseas in the 3rd Maori Contingent, the Pioneer Battalion, the New Zealand Tunnelling Company (NZTC) and the Rarotongan Company. He returned to Tautu, Aitutaki in 1922.

**80c The Pioneer Battalion.** Made up of Maori and Pacific Islanders, the Pioneer Battalion (or the Maori Pioneer Battalion) was among the first New Zealand units at the Somme in September 1916. They eventually returned to New Zealand in 1919.

**80c The Arras tunnels.** The NZTC built roads and, more significantly, dugouts and tunnels underground near Arras 1916-1917. The Arras tunnels incorporated the names of many New Zealand cities and towns; depicted is the Maori greeting Kia Ora, which means 'be well' or 'be healthy'

**80c Conscription introduced.** The Military Service Act became law on 1 August 1916. Compulsory enlistment in the armed forces for national service arrived by 15 September 1916.

**80c The Middle East.** In the Middle East theatre the ANZAC Mounted Rifles Division, the Imperial Camel Corps and the Egyptian Expeditionary Force fought the Battle of Magdhaba and pushed back the Ottoman forces from the Suez Canal.

**80c The Somme.** In September 1916 some 15000 NZEF troops commenced fighting the Battle of the Somme in northern France. In terms of human lives lost this was one of New Zealand's costliest campaigns of the war – by the time the NZEF and artillery were withdrawn, 18 November 1916, approximately 2000 had been killed and 6000 wounded.

**\$2.00 The first Anzac Day.** 25 April 1916 saw Anzac Day church services throughout New Zealand. Depicted is the service held in Nelson Church.

**\$2.00 Away from the Front.** Bloomsbury Square, London became the headquarters of the NZEF in the UK. This was the base for New Zealand servicemen from the Western Front while on leave or while waiting to deploy or return home.

**\$2.50 The Battle of Jutland.** This largest naval battle of the First World War took place on 31 May 1916. HMS New Zealand joined the British Royal Navy's Grand Fleet under Admiral Sir John Jellicoe and engaged in battle in the North Sea near Jutland in Denmark the German Navy's High Seas Fleet under Vice-Admiral Reinhard Scheer.

**\$2.50 The home front.** Letters, postcards and telegrams were essential means of communication between New Zealand and those on active service. Many packages of home comforts were also sent to the front line. Depicted is Kaikoura Post & Telegraph Office.

Considerable further details, especially regarding Cook Islander Solomon Isaacs, are contained in the third prestige booklet.

## **ICC Cricket World Cup 2015 India Edition (4 February 2015)**

Full details of this alternative version of the 2015 ICC Cricket World Cup sheetlet are given as lot 219(a) on page 10 of this Newsletter.

**Technical details are as follows:**

Jointly designed by Helcia Knap, New Zealand Post Ltd, Wellington and India Post Philately, Mumbai, India; printed by Southern Colour Print Ltd, Dunedin by offset lithography in the four process colours plus synseal overgloss, imperf round self-adhesive stamps separated by roulettes on ordinary non-phosphor self-adhesive stamp paper of a different quality and thickness; fourteen stamps in a sheetlet. Produced on request by NZ Post for India Post Philately to commemorate India ICC Cricket World Cup Champions 1983 and 2011.

## **NZ Pride in Print Awards 2016**

Congratulations to New Zealand Post for winning the Supreme Award at New Zealand's premier printing industry awards, the NZ Pride in Print Awards 2016. The winning stamp was the 2015 All Blacks Jersey stamp, which was printed on fabric used in the Adidas jerseys worn by the World Cup winning All Blacks last year, S1554a. This stamp also won the Industry Development Category. Southern Colour Print Production Manager Mick Cullen said, "How do we print on a rugby jersey? It was something different and we took it on. It wasn't easy but we made it work." The Supreme Award was officially presented to Southern Colour Print in Dunedin in June.

## New Zealand 1950 Canterbury Centennial Artists Drawings

Here are five artworks from the talented New Zealand artist James Berry of Wellington for proposed stamps for the 1950 set of commemoratives for the Centennial of Canterbury, New Zealand. Each is a large finished stamp proposal 15cmx24.5cm, on thick cream art paper on backing-board, with an actual stamp size photographic reproduction inset under the design.

**3(a)** Design for a 1d value, depicting the original settlers arrival in Lyttelton in 1850. Between images of the farming community are the four ships of the arrival fleet under an inset of John Godley. There are two inscriptions: "Founded in Faith ... Blessed in Fruition" at top and "They Passed This Way" at the base. Suggested colours were dark green and deep orange. **\$950**

**(b)** Design for a 2d value (and an original sketch of same), depicting the interior of Christchurch Cathedral, with a Centennial Thanksgiving Service in progress. The inscription along the top reads: "Praise God from Whom all Blessings Flow". Suggested colour was scarlet-lake or purple. **\$1250**

**(c)** Design for a 3d value is a splendid drawing of a 1950's airplane loading mail at Harewood Airport, Christchurch. Appropriately 'the 3d value is the inland airmail postage rate and two would represent the postage on air letter cards to Britain.' **\$1250**

**(d)** Design for a 6d value, depicting the Provincial Council Chambers, Christchurch. This has the River Avon in the foreground and the frame contains a mace, a paddle and trowels, together with leaves from sycamore, copper-beach, common-birch and willow trees. Suggested colours were dark blue and mid-green. **\$950**

**(e)** Design for an alternative 6d value, depicting Christ's College, Christchurch in 1950. This is a superb detailed drawing of the main college buildings with an ivy covered building in the centre. The inscription at top reads: " Bene Tradita Bene Servanda" **\$950**

## 2015 ICC Cricket World Cup 2015 India Edition

On 4 February 2015 New Zealand Post released a self-adhesive sheetlet of 14 imperf round self-adhesive 'cricket ball-shaped' stamps to commemorate the forthcoming ICC Cricket World Cup 2015 being held in Australia and New Zealand, SM1503-16. The issue was described in detail in the April and May 2015 CP Newsletters.

From what we can now gather sometime late 2014/early 2015 India Post Philately, Mumbai, India contacted New Zealand Post to enquire about the possibility of having produced for them a special India Edition of this cricket sheetlet. This was agreed to and Southern Colour Print Ltd, Dunedin printed an alternative version of this sheetlet. The entire printing was shipped to Mumbai and sold from the Philatelic Bureau there.

On the surface the stamps themselves seem identical but if they are placed under a UV light they are revealed as being printed on ordinary non-phosphor self-adhesive paper of a different quality and thickness. The sheetlet itself looks quite different: the headline at the top of the sheetlet "14 TEAMS. 1 CHAMPION" is now in blue, from white; the ICC CWC 2015 logo moves from centre to top right; and where the logo was now has a picture of the ICC Cricket World Cup itself with the wording "Est '75 ICC Cricket World Cup Champions 1983 & 2011 INDIA". In addition the reverse of the sheetlet is now blank, with the barcode, value & number details and Code omitted.
