N.Z. NOTES AND COMMENT

GEORGE VI $2 /-$ Inverted sideways Watermark
A supply of the above, (two sheets), was offered to me last week, and I accepted them and immediately forwarded copies to those I thought would be interested. The variety is not new, one sheet at least having been reported from the South Island towards the end of last year. I never had any real information as to the number then found. However, I had to assess a value and I decided that in ratio to the $3 /-$ invert at $12 / 6 \mathrm{~d}$ (I wish I had some!), 6/- seemed reasonable. Those sent out went at this figure. Almost immediately I had word of two more sheets and I have decided that the price must be reduced. As advertised below, the price now is $4 / 6 d$. As it is obviously unfair that my "regulars" should pay more than others, everyone who accepted copies at $6 /-$ will be credjted with $1 / 6$. per copy accepted.

The whole affair served to throw into relief the difficulty of assigning a fair value to a current stamp, The service I am endeavouring to give - and which a large number of customers obviously want - is the supplying at once of every new variety reported. This gives the collectors the chance of picking up varieties which will later be rarities and it might be argued that it is reasonable that these collectors should not object if. (as in this case) my early assessment.is a little higher than the latar market value. An important factor, nevertheless, is that these are my special customers and I have no intention that they should suffer. Accordingly in future.. it is to be an understood thing that if, within one month after dietribution. a variety becomes appreciably commoner than had been thought, I will be prepared to adjust the matter with those collectors who have purchased at the original price. Beyond the period of one month I do not think I can reasonably be asked to go. It should be remembered that I do not as a rule find varieties myself but have to purchase them at a premium from the finders.

This type of "new variety" service is something which I do not think has been tried before in New Zealand and we will have to iron out the rough spots as they become apparent.

A-further difficulty I have noticed is that when I advertise a pair of shades, as in the 6 d . and $1 / 3 \mathrm{a}_{\text {, }}$ this month, quite $a$ few collectors may feel sure they have one already. To clear this hurdle I hereby state that anyone ordering a pair of shades is at liberty to accept one and return the other, paying half the advertised price.
CORRECTION - COOK ISIANDS.
The item, Lot S5, in the No. 1 Supplement, was wrongly stated to be the 4d. This should have been the ? 11 . This can be described as a "lapsus philatelicus" and was caused, one must suppose, by my getting a drop of midnight oil in my eye. My apologies to those who have been misled. The repetition of the error in the No. 2 Newsletter was occasioned by the fact that the No. 1 Supplement and the No. 2 Newsletter were written virtually simultaneously and the error was not noticed before both had been printed. Pleasc alter Newsletters which have been filed for reference.
PERFORATIONS.
A most interesting point is apparent in the perforations of most of the current lower value Georges ( $\frac{7}{2} \mathrm{~d}$. to 9d). I will deal with it later but collectors may care to try to spotit. Try comparing the left side perfs of the 5 th stamp in from the right in the bottom row of the sheet with the perfs of the stamp immediately above it.
A difference will be seen and those who understand the working if a comb machine should be able to make certain deductions.

SPACE AVAILABLE.
I am disturbed at the small amount of space available for Notes at present. When the circulation rises I will see what can be done about increasing the size of the Newsictter.
