New Issue Notes

Aurora Australis (Southern Lights) (8 February 2017)

Aurora was the Roman goddess of dawn, and appropriately enough often seen around dawn are luminous electrical radiations from the South Magnetic Pole – the Aurora Australis or Southern Lights.

More usually associated with Antarctica – and thus a Ross Dependency issue – this however is an attractive, brightly coloured, set of six stamps from New Zealand, more specifically from the summit of Mt John in the Mackenzie Basin, South Island. The Aoraki Mackenzie Basin International Dark-Sky Reserve is the largest dark-sky reserve in the world, established in June 2012, being completely devoid of man-made light.

Also pictured on four of the stamps and the miniature sheet is the University of Canterbury's Mt John Observatory. The stamps from this miniature sheet are printed using a special silver-foil, replicating the shimmering effects of the aurora. It is nice to have a miniature sheet that does not completely duplicate the set of stamps for a change and this one, and indeed the six sheet stamps, works well – a most pleasing set.

Designed by Jonathan Grey, New Zealand Post, Wellington; FDC photo by Dallas Poll and miniature sheet photo by Joel Gillespie. Printed by Southern Colour Print Ltd, Dunedin by offset lithography in the four process colours, perf $14\frac{1}{2}x14$, six gummed stamps in sheets of 25 on Tullis Russell 104gsm red-phosphor gummed stamp-paper and a six stamp miniature sheet produced using a special silver-foil.

Native New Zealand Freshwater Fish (1 March 2017)

More than forty native freshwater species have been identified in New Zealand. However, thirty of these natives are endangered due to various issues such as introduced predators (eg trout!), habitat destruction and man-made barriers on their migration routes (eg dams).

The five fish on the stamps are portrayed in an illustrative style on natural background colours. DOC (the Department of Conservation) has deemed each fish depicted to have a degree of rarity.

Designs:

\$1.00 - Lowland Longjaw Galaxias, so named for its distinctive upturned lower jaw

1.80 - Redfin Bully or Toitoi, which has taught itself to climb above waterfalls, where it likes to live

2.20 – Longfin Eel or Tuna, can grow to over two-metres (over $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet) in length and live for over 100 years

2.70 - Lamprey or 'vampire parasite', Kanakana or Piharau, has no jaw, instead has a round mouth lined with many sharp rasping teeth, with which they attach themselves to other fish

New Issue Notes (cont.)

\$3.30 Torrentfish or Panoko, has a zebra-style camouflage for fast-flowing water and resembles its marine relative the blue-cod

There is also a five stamp shaped miniature sheet which is otherwise identical to the sheet stamps. However the stamps from the Freshwater Fish Limited Edition are different to the normal sheet stamps. These are from a special printing and have gloss coating highlights. This certainly does make the image of the fish stand out, especially the eel and the galaxias. This variation is footnoted in the CP Catalogue.

Designed by Stephen Fuller, Wellington and printed by Southern Colour Print Ltd, Dunedin by offset lithography in the four process colours, perf $14\frac{1}{2}x14$. Five gummed stamps in sheets of 25 and a five-stamp miniature sheet on Tullis Russell 104gsm red-phosphor gummed stamp-paper.

More New Discoveries

NZ Second Sidefaces

From Mr John Geary of Dunedin comes a used $\frac{1}{2}$ d SSF perf 11 wmk W.4, which is D1e. This is clearly datestamped 26 Dec 1896 – thus the CP Catalogue date of '1897' needs to be revised to '1896'.

NZ Arms Type Fiscals

From Mr Arthur Willis of Sydney, Australia comes a used copy of Z31a 1931 2/6d deep brown Arms with an abnormal watermark variety. This stamp, whilst having the 'Z' normal, has the 'N' of the 'NZ' watermark reversed. Most unusual!

2017 NZ Post Postage Rates Increases

Saturday 1 July 2017 saw a range of postage rate increases. Fortunately Standard Post, which is \$1.00 medium, \$2.00 large and \$3.00 oversize, remains unchanged. There are increases however to FastPost rates as follows: medium up from \$1.80 to \$2.30, large up from \$2.80 to \$3.30 and oversize up from \$3.80 to \$4.30.

New stamps at \$2.30 and \$4.30 have already been produced, on 7 June 2017, for these new FastPost rates and extra printings made of the \$3.30 denomination. It will be interesting to see if new printings will also be required of the 'make-up' stamp 50c Lake Coleridge Canterbury.

Airmail rates for letters are unchanged, although Airmail parcels under 2kg have increased by an average of 4%
